



## GUSTS OF WIND

### ORANGE VIGILANCE – VIOLENT WINDS

violent winds between 90 km/h and 110 km/h

Possible consequences	Conduct to adopt
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• broken tree branches;</li><li>• some fallen trees;</li><li>• damaged roofs and chimneys;</li><li>• vehicles swerving off the roads;</li><li>• localised disrupted road traffic, in particular in wooded areas.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• limit your journeys;</li><li>• limit your speed on the road, especially if the vehicle or trailer you are driving may be affected by the wind;</li><li>• do not go walking in wooded areas;</li><li>• in towns, be careful of falling objects;</li><li>• tidy away or fix down any objects liable to be blown around or damaged, for example garden furniture, parasols, etc.;</li><li>• on no account go onto a roof.</li></ul>

### RED VIGILANCE – VERY VIOLENT GALE

winds above 110 km/h

Possible consequences	Conduct to adopt
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• much significant damage to housing, parks and plantations;</li><li>• heavily affected forests (significant damage to trees/uprooted trees);</li><li>• very difficult traffic conditions throughout the network, cars forced off the road;</li><li>• seriously affected air and rail traffic.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• if possible, remain at home;</li><li>• if you need to travel, limit yourself to what is strictly necessary and avoid wooded areas;</li><li>• tell someone that you are going out and your destination;</li><li>• tidy away or fix down any objects liable to be blown around or damaged, for example garden furniture, parasols, etc.;</li><li>• on no account go onto a roof;</li><li>• phone 112 immediately if someone is injured;</li><li>• phone 112 concerning objects on public roads only if they constitute a serious obstruction (trees, branches, roofing debris).</li></ul>
